

WESTERLY, RHODE ISLAND — May 2016 Darlington Fabrics partners with Waste Management to achieve Zero Waste to Landfill status.

Darlington produces 602 tons of waste yearly; 183.7 tons (33.2%) are recycled. The remaining 416 tons (66.8%) of waste that were sent to landfill are now diverted to a waste-to-energy plant.

Working together each month Darlington and Waste Management are saving*:

- 13,523 kW-hrs. of electricity
Enough to power 1 home for a full year
- 340 gallons of oil
Enough energy to heat and cool 2 homes for a full year
- 79 gallons of gasoline
Enough gasoline to drive 2,216 miles
- 40 mature trees
Enough to produce 490,375 sheets of newspaper
- 23,087 gallons of water
Enough to meet the fresh water needs of 1,232 people for a month
- 12 cubic yards of landfill airspace
Enough airspace to meet the disposal needs of a community of 177 people
